on the organisation of graduate teacher unions in the United States

- having regard to Rule 116 of its Rules of Procedure,
 - A. noting the Universal Declaration of Human Rights states, "Everyone has the right to form and to join trade unions for the protection of his interests" (Article 23 (4)),
 - B. concerned that under President Bush, the National Labor Relations Board stripped graduate teachers of the right to organise collectively, denying US labour law protection to over 40,000 teachers,
 - C. aware that graduate teachers at Yale and Columbia universities are seeking to gain voluntary recognition from their universities after independent observers certified that they represent a majority of graduate teachers,
 - D. recognising that academic unions have helped to protect jobs and made a positive contribution to preserving academic freedom and intellectual standards,
1. calls on the EU Commission and Member States to ask the Bush administration to reverse this decision,
 2. urges Member States to affirm solidarity with the Graduate Employees and Students Organization (GESO) at Yale, and the Graduate Student Employees United (GSEU) at Columbia in their struggle for union recognition,
 3. calls on Yale President, Richard Levin, and Columbia President, Lee Bollinger, to recognise GESO and GSEU and immediately commence contract negotiations,
 4. instructs its President to forward this declaration, together with the names of the signatories, to the EU Council and the United States Government
